Advantages of A Levels

- ❖ A Levels allow for a modular study system, which means a student can take exams each May/June and in *some subjects*, in November. Students are entered for examinations once they are fully prepared.
- ❖ Apart from the course content, A Levels also aim to develop life skills, such as communication, independent research, problem solving skills, team work and initiative.

How much does it cost ?

To establish a programme for your child , the first step is a meeting with the Director of Studies at Ceic International School.

How do I enroll a student?

- ❖ Student details must be sent to CEIC and an application form completed.
- ❖ Details of the student's academic history must be sent to CEIC.
- ❖ Students need to have a good level of English, as all the course material and classes will be delivered in English. CEIC can provide additional support in this area. Students may be required to complete an English course before being able to start the IGCSE programme.
- ❖ In the event of doubt as to whether any boy or girl was qualified to take the A Level we may wish to administer a pre-test in both Maths and English. Younger children or those not qualified to take the A Level course may take an IGCSE courses. IGCSE covers the knowledge and understanding required in order to start on an A Level course.
- ❖ The registration fee and deposit should be paid, the terms and conditions accepted, and a payment schedule agreed.
